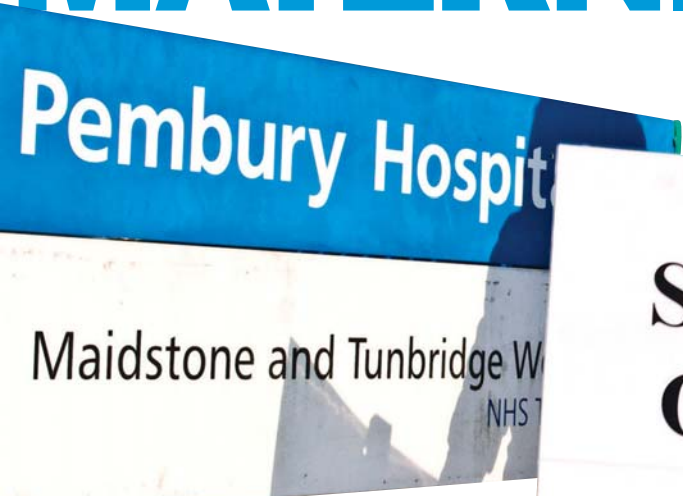

MAIDSTONE COMMUNITY UNITES IN MATERNITY FIGHT FOR SERVICES



Helen leads the way

In true British Dunkirk spirit people from all walks turned out to help with the battle. Scores of Mums, Dads and their families from all over the Maidstone area came to support a campaign that matters to everyone – the protection of mums in childbirth. M.A.S.H. (Maidstone Action for Services in Hospital) executive committee member Helen Grant felt not enough was being done to highlight and oppose the effects of a decision by Maidstone & Tunbridge Wells NHS Trust.

They intend to close the consultant led full maternity facility in Maidstone and replace it with a midwife-run birthing unit in 2011. The area's main maternity unit will then be based at the new Pembury Hospital, 17 miles from Maidstone just outside Tunbridge Wells. Helen publicised this threat to Maidstone families by walking the route whilst pushing a pram for almost 6 hours on Sunday 27th September. A convoy of lorries as long as a freight train turned up at the start of the Pram push at Maidstone Hospital, festooned with banners and driven by furious Dads and their families to demonstrate the strength of feeling across the community. Former BBC SE Today presenter Geoff Clark came with his loud hailer and counted the crowd down to the start of the push at 9.00am. All along the way people came out of their homes to applaud and wave on the entourage, with passing drivers tooting their horns in support.

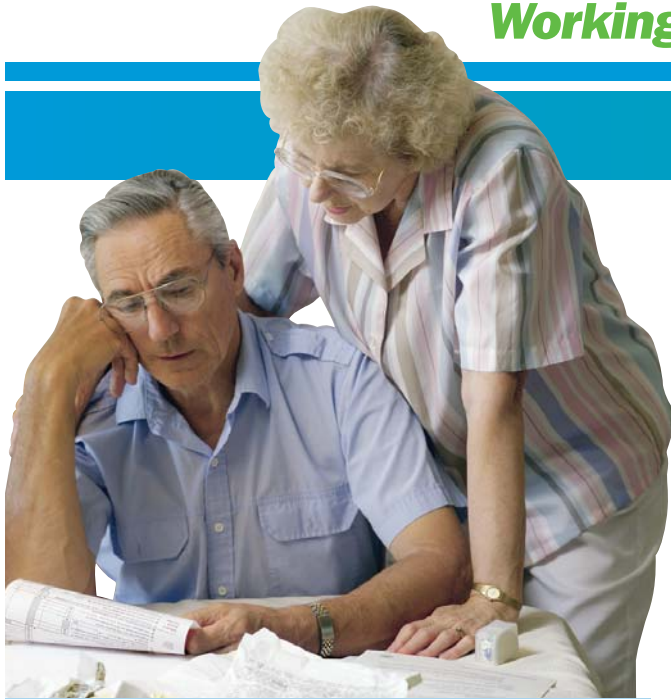
Arriving at Pembury Hospital at the end of the long and arduous 17 mile push Helen said "Stiff legs, sore feet and a few blisters, but that is nothing compared with the stress, pain and potential threats that will be endured by Maidstone Mums having to travel this journey whilst in a dangerous stage of labour. I hope the Pram Push has served to highlight the issue and raise public awareness. We must now continue to apply pressure and seek a review of the decision by the Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells NHS Trust." A large petition is developing with thousands of signatures that will be delivered by Helen and the MASH team to the Shadow Minister for Health, Andrew Lansley MP, the Current Minister for Health, Andy Burnham MP and the Chief Executive of the Maidstone & Tunbridge Wells NHS Trust.

A WELCOME SERVICE FOR OUR OLDER RESIDENTS

Need a helping hand with your cleaning or gardening? Like to lighten your load with the laundry and ironing? Helen Grant talked with Age Concern Maidstone's chief executive Paul Coles to find out what might be on the table.

She learned that for just £12 per hour, carefully vetted staff from well known charity Age Concern, can provide shopping escorts, doctor/medical appointment escorts, and help with laundry, ironing, gardening and cleaning.

Age Concern Maidstone's Independent Living Service was launched in response to a demand from older residents for all of these kinds of task and it is proving to be a real success. Since the service was launched in January 2009 they have already had to increase their staff by 50% to cope with demand.

Mr Coles said "From our experience of working with older people we know that they trust our name and they know that when we offer a service for an hour they will receive a full hour's service. To ensure our clients safety all our staff are Criminal Record Bureau checked. They are a really friendly and committed team, and not there just to carry out domestic tasks. We ask them to be our eyes and ears and to befriend our clients".

Mrs Grant said "I am committed to doing all I can for our older residents and am pleased to be able to promote this excellent service."

TORY BOROUGH COUNCIL REALISES AMBITIONS

When the Conservatives gained overall control of Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) in May 2008 they stated a clear ambition to regenerate the Borough. Part of their strategy requires attracting businesses to start up or re-locate to the area, to increase prosperity and help make Maidstone a place where people want to live and work. The provision of excellent sporting, leisure and cultural amenities forms the heart of such an attraction and Maidstone & The Weald Matters decided to find out what has been achieved so far?

Councillor Brian Moss – Cabinet Member for Leisure and Culture, sets out his stall for us;

New athletics training facility: In partnership with Sutton Valance School, MBC have completed the construction of an all weather running track together with provisions for field events. This will allow the Maidstone and Medway Athletics club to have first class training facilities which will be extended to local schools and the community. The track was recently

opened by Sir Roger Bannister – the world's first four minute miler.

'Maidstone's Dream' campaign: This encourages business sponsorship of Maidstone's outstanding athletes and is proving popular and successful with an increasing number of athletes being sponsored until the 2012 Olympic Games. The dream is to 'bring home a medal to Maidstone'!

The Exchange Arts Centre: New Investment has provided extra performance space and much better facilities including the 'Graham Clarke' gallery to showcase the work of local artists. The centre now provides a wider range of entertainment too, with a buzz!

Maidstone Museum: A £3.7 million extension to the Maidstone Museum has received a Heritage Lottery Fund grant of £2 million. The extension will provide increased display space, much better facilities and an educational suite to service the growing popularity of the museum with both schools and adults. Further funding is underway for the balance without being a burden on the council tax payer. Work is due to start next spring.

Mote Park: A £2 million grant for the regeneration of Mote Park has also been obtained from the Heritage Lottery Fund. This magnificent jewel in the heart of Maidstone has been neglected for many years and will now provide better leisure and educational facilities to be enjoyed by all.

The Leisure Centre in Mote Park: This is undergoing renovation which will be completed next spring and will provide a much improved leisure experience.

High Street Improvement Project: This project has considerable support from local businesses and on its completion will be a prominent feature of the town.

Councillor Moss said: "In these difficult financial times we are achieving our ambitions by applying for grants and raising funds from other non-council revenue sources. Under a Conservative banner we are proud to provide the services our residents should expect from a first class borough. We will all gain from this success".

NATIONAL PILOT TO HELP WORKLESS FAMILIES LAUNCHED IN MAIDSTONE

A special 2 year project to be based in Maidstone, Kent has been unveiled by national employment charity Tomorrow's People.

Prospective MP Helen Grant who is the Tomorrow's People Patron for the Maidstone region helped launch the plan at the Conservative Party Conference in Manchester. She said "From new research Tomorrow's People have identified that there are almost 5 million families in this country where multiple generations have never been in long term work. This is a pilot for a national initiative to tackle the problem and I am especially pleased that they have selected Maidstone as the location. My role as Patron is to help promote and develop the charity in a multitude of ways locally, regionally and nationally. I am looking forward to starting my work with the team on this special project.

The work of Tomorrow's People is not just about jobs, it is about self esteem, self confidence and unlocking some of the pathways to achieving the elusive goal of social mobility, something that is close to my own heart and my political platform".

Tomorrow's People believe that there may be far reaching benefits from this initiative, not just for the members of the families involved, but also to the local community and to the tax payer in helping reduce the huge cost of welfare benefits. Funding is still needed before the 2 year project can proceed but Tomorrow's People are hopeful that this obstacle can be overcome shortly. Their overarching mission is to break the cycle of unemployment and dependency by helping the most disadvantaged to get, and keep, a job. Nationally Tomorrow's People has assisted over 400,000 long-term unemployed people since 1984.

CONSERVATIVE PARTY CONFERENCE REPORT



The Conservatives, we keep being told, mustn't "bang on about Europe". No one is interested in the subject. In one sense, this is true. If by "Europe" we mean the Brussels bureaucracy, people see it as far less important than, say, the loss of an important train service, or the downgrading of local hospital services.

But Europe can't be divorced from domestic politics. An almost unbelievable 84 per cent of our legislation comes from Brussels. Every British government department is touched. Even matters with no cross-border angle, issues that you'd assume were wholly domestic, often turn out to be regulated by the EU. The row over fortnightly versus weekly bin collection was a direct consequence of the EU's Landfill Directive. The Home Information Pack was caused by the Brussels requirement to have an ecological survey of every dwelling. The closure of rural post offices is being driven, at least in part, by the EU's Postal Services Directive. The hassle involved in opening a bank account these days, with all your old utilities bills, is a consequence of the EU's Money Laundering Directive.

The list goes on and on. The prohibition of a range of higher dose vitamin and mineral supplements? Brussels. The closure of our abattoirs, and the longer and more distressing journeys for livestock? Brussels. The decline of the honeybee? Brussels. Car seats for 12-year-olds? Brussels.

The point is not that the EU is wrong about every one of these issues. It's that we ought to determine them ourselves, not have them decreed by Commissioners whom no one can vote for, and then applied uniformly to 500 million Europeans.

That's why the Conservative Party is not afraid to talk about the EU. It's not Europe we're obsessed by; it's Britain, and British democracy. We need to get powers back from Brussels, to take decisions more closely to the people they affect. And we need the referendum that all three parties promised at the last election, but that Labour and the LibDems no longer support.

If you want Britain to be part of a country called Europe – a single polity, with its own President, foreign policy, criminal justice system, military capacity and constitution – then by all means vote Lib-Lab.

If you want us to be an independent nation, trading with Europe but governing ourselves, I hope you'll vote Conservative. But please don't say it doesn't matter.

The Liberal Democrats are the UK's most pro-European federalist party. They would sell our sovereignty without a second thought. Don't let them do it!

STOP KIG

PUBLIC ENQUIRY NOW UNDERWAY

HOW YOU CAN HELP...

The Kent International Gateway (KIG) is a proposal to obliterate a massive area of green space just north of beautiful Bearstead with a four million ft² industrial estate. Local outrage at this monstrous development has been massive from the start and quickly resulted in the formation of an opposition pressure group known as STOPKIG.

A public enquiry commenced on October 13th and is expected to last for 8 weeks, ending in early December.

STOPKIG organisers are calling for people to go along and listen to the enquiry taking place. This will show clear and ongoing public opposition and may help with the outcome. The enquiry is taking place in Kent House, Romney Place, Maidstone ME15 6LH. Tel 01622 695700.

Helen Grant has been a member of STOPKIG since November 2007 and is an active campaigner against the proposal. She said "Whilst the KIG site is not actually within the constituency of Maidstone & The Weald it is right on our doorstep and the negative effects of the development will undoubtedly be suffered by people from miles around. Many, many people I have canvassed and surveyed within Maidstone & The Weald have indicated strong opposition to the project and that is why I stand with them and say No to KIG!"

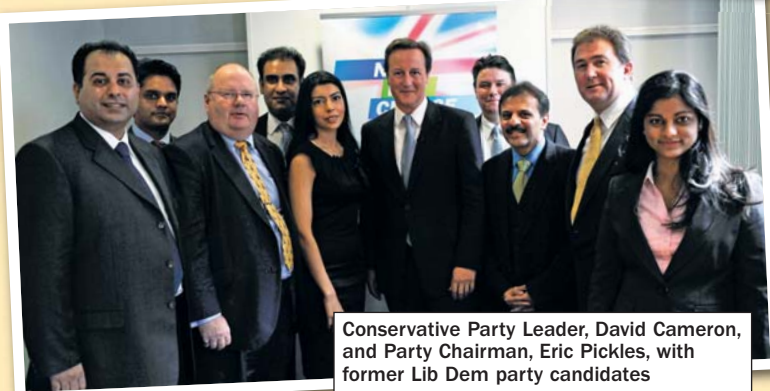
